



Commission Chair Bledsoe, Commission Members, County Executive Miller, Ladies and Gentlemen:

My name is Pat Hunter, taxpayer, and resident of Loudon County. I would ask that my comments be made a part of the official Minutes of this meeting;

I would like to go on record to voice my objection to the two (2) names offered in nomination to serve on the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission. There are serious key issues that face the community; an important contract with regard to the operations of the sanitary landfill is up for bid in the near future, how do we know whether these individuals are qualified to effectively deal with this important issue? It is also crucial to find a landfill operator that can run the landfill efficiently and cost effectively in order to bring tipping fees to competitive pricing with neighboring Class 1 landfills. There is something very wrong with this picture, when areas like Tellico Village can send their garbage out-of-county in view of higher fuel costs and get more bang for their buck rather than bring their garbage to the nearby Loudon County sanitary Class I landfill.

The selection process for Board member nominations is seriously flawed when the public is kept in the dark about prospective candidates. Today's commission Agenda does not include the names of the candidates. A Resolution with names was included in the commissioner's packet but there was no background information available for citizens to view on Friday afternoon. This process does not promote trust or confidence in the decision making process. Local county government should strive for an open government that promotes public dialogue; candidates should be publicly interviewed to learn more about their backgrounds, qualifications, and asked about their views on related Board matters. Followed by a report from a nominations committee available for public inspection.

In my opinion, this Board is not representative of the community and it is not diverse, there are no women, no minorities or disadvantaged citizens proposed to serve on this Board. According to U.S. Census Bureau 2001 profile of general demographics, women comprise 51.3% of the total population in Loudon County. I think the makeup of a Board needs to better represent the community's diverse interests. If approved, this is one of three Boards that I can think of in recent times, this Commission has voted upon comprised solely of one gender and one race classification. The first example that comes to mind was the removal of a female individual from the county beer board without just cause, and just a few months back the re-nomination of an individual to serve on the cable authority Board.

Why were women and minorities not considered to serve on this Board? Several qualified individuals come to mind that more than meet the criteria for service on this Board? I can think of a person knowledgeable in solid waste matters and a past solid waste citizen representative. She is an outspoken citizen on this subject that keeps informed by attending public meetings and researches environmental issues. There are qualified women and businesswomen that would serve. A garbage disposal center (convenience center) sits in the heart of a community comprised mainly of minorities in the 2nd and 5th Districts, why were the names of individuals from the Riverview community not selected for nomination to serve on this important board; they have filled this room on several occasions to voice concerns about garbage being located in their neighborhood?

Past county commission's have appointed individuals to serve on the Solid Waste Disposal Board that could care less about a promise made to the community many years ago, to keep from taking out-of-county waste! Recently, Commission Chair Roy Bledsoe spoke about keeping a past promise and commitment to remove the two-cent tax on rural debt once the debt is fully paid in the near future. I appreciate the commitment to honor the removal of the 2-cent tax but I do not understand why the county feels one promise made to the community isn't as important as another promise made to the community.

Loudon County government runs a multi-million dollar operation and improving procedures for nominating candidates for Boards is an absolute must! America is the melting pot of a free people with diverse cultures, ethnicities, race, varied economic backgrounds, and creed. I am deeply disappointed that this newly elected Commission does not share the view of selecting from a diverse representation of the community to serve on the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Board since this Board and many other Boards perform important functions that affect taxpayer pocket books, formulate and implement significant public policies that directly impact the environment and the quality of life of citizens that reside in our community.

April 7, 2003 Loudon County Commission Meeting

My name is Aileen Longmire, a citizen and taxpayer of Loudon County. I live in Matlock Bend in the First District.

I wish to speak about appointments to the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission listed on the agenda tonight under County Executive George Miller. Monday March 24, 2003 I attended the county commission workshop meeting. Appointments to the Solid Waste Commission were only briefly mentioned and the only discussion was by County Commissioner Don Miller from Tellico Village (7th District). He was presenting a name for consideration but did not state the name or any information aloud. How were people at the meeting suppose to get information or be able to ask questions to find out the qualifications, backgrounds and views of the nominees? This is one of the most critical boards to serve on in the county due to the serious issues involved such as the environmental impact not only to the 1st District but also to the entire county. Also at big issue is the documented promise that was made by County Commission and other public officials that this Loudon County Landfill located in Matlock Bend would not accept out of county waste. Where do the nominees stand on this serious issue? The current contract by Santek to operate the landfill expires in the near future (months). What is the background of the nominees concerning this issue? As I look at tonight's agenda the names are not even listed, why?

After the March 24, 2003 commission workshop meeting I asked 7th District Commissioner Don Miller the name of his nominee and he told me but the opportunity for questions at the open meeting was gone. I also asked him why he was making a nomination for this landfill commission position since the landfill is not located in his district (Tellico Village) or anywhere near him and that the garbage from Tellico Village is not brought to the County Landfill. His answer was that it might someday. I then attempted to ask 1st District Commissioner Nancy Marcus the name of the other nominee and she walked off without answering. I also was planning to inform her of a serious erosion problem at the coal fly ash landfill also located in Matlock Bend that was washing toward the TN. River but was not given the opportunity. I then asked 1st District Commissioner David Meers the name of the other nominee to the Solid Waste Disposal Commission and he just flat refused to share the name with me, why? It is a fact that we have 3 landfills, Loudon County Landfill, TN. Waste Movers Inc. Class IV Landfill, and the Coal Fly Ash Landfill located in Matlock Bend in the 1st

District. There are serious problems existing now and will continue to exist in the future with these landfills and the problems must be acknowledged and dealt with by commissioners. You cannot ignore them and hope they will go away. There are some of us in the 1st District that are dealing with the possibility of serious health, safety and welfare issues (water, air, quality of life and property values) concerning these landfills and their location, also the issues that State Laws have been broken by illegally transporting and dumping hazardous waste from a known Superfund Site and very little has been done by local officials to clear up these problems. I guess that I thought that we would all be on the same side and work on these problems together as we have in the past.

I am asking commission to defer voting on the Loudon County Solid Waste Disposal Commission nominee appointments until there is a public forum and information provided with ample time for questions and answers from the public and other interested parties. The agenda for tonight's meeting does not even list the names of the nominees, why? If County Commission denies this request, let the record show that I am opposed to the Solid Waste Commission nominee appointments being presented tonight for consideration due to the fact that there has been no public identification of names or information provided prior to the vote tonight. As a concerned citizen and property owner in Matlock Bend where the County Landfill is located, I should have had the chance to ask questions and view information prior to this vote.

Other items on the agenda for consideration tonight under County Executive George Miller concern water and sewage lines in the Greenback area. Since the County Executive and County Commission are looking into these type improvements for areas in Loudon County, I guess this would be a good time to put Matlock Bend's name in the hat.

I am requesting that Loudon County furnish water and sewer to the citizens and property owners in Matlock Bend since we have 3 landfills in our neighborhood and our well water may now or at some point and time be unfit to drink due to contamination. Regular water testing in the meantime by the County would be helpful.

An item not on the agenda I would like to address briefly is a letter that I requested County Executive Miller and/or County Commission to send to Nashville (Betsy Child and others) back at the December 2002 County



Commission meeting. It was to file a complaint against Mike Apple and Larry Cook of TDEC for granting the vertical expansion of 50 feet to the TN. Waste Movers Inc. Class IV unlined Landfill in Matlock Bend. The illegal waste hauled from Lenoir City Car Works Superfund/Hazardous Substance Site and illegally dumped at this landfill (notice of violation issued June 28, 2001) has not been cleaned up. More waste should not be put on top pushing this hazardous waste further and faster into the ground. A letter dated March 10, 2003 was sent to Child but not in the form of a complaint. In my opinion, it is a brief letter with no teeth. ^{I will share it with} ~~files no complaint.~~ the audience at this time. May I suggest a stronger letter and follow up phone calls to Ms. Childs and other State and Federal Officials until we get help on this cleanup. I have a paper here that states cleanup has begun in Knox County of the Coster Shop Superfund Waste that was illegally dumped. The same scenario of broken state laws took place here in our County. We deserve cleanup also and as soon as possible.

My comments, requests and questions are being presented in writing tonight to be made a part of the official record of this April 7, 2003 Loudon County Commission Meeting.

WHEREAS, Loudon County, in accordance with Chapter 7 §13-7-201 through §13-7-204 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, may from time to time, amend any regulation of or within any district, or any other provision of any zoning resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Regional Planning Commission has forwarded its recommendation regarding the amendment to the Zoning Resolution of Loudon County, Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, a notice of public hearing and a description of the ordinance appeared in the Loudon County News-Herald on March 16-17, 2003, consistent with the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated §13-7-203; and

WHEREAS, the promotion of public health, safety, general welfare and most appropriate land uses are stated purposes of the Zoning Resolution of Loudon County, Tennessee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Zoning Resolution of Loudon County, Tennessee be amended as follows (*amendments are in bold and italicized*):

Section 4.200 Fireworks Storage and Distribution:

A. ***Purpose:*** *To ensure the health and safety of the general public by regulating the sale and storage of firework devices. For the purpose of this Resolution, the definition of fireworks shall be governed by the State of Tennessee through the Department of Commerce and Insurance, Division of Fire Prevention.*

B. ***Requirements for the Sale and Storage of Fireworks:***
The retail sales and storage of fireworks devices are only allowed in C-2 (General Commercial) Districts when approved as a special exception use by the Loudon County Board of Zoning Appeals. The sales and storage of fireworks may only occur from a permanent building meeting the minimum requirements of the State of Tennessee Division of Fire Prevention and local building and fire safety codes. Sales and storage of fireworks devices from temporary structures for seasonal purposes are only permitted on the site of an approved permanent sales location by the owner of the permanent fireworks business. Temporary structures and days and times of operation must comply with the requirements of the State of Tennessee's Division of Fire Prevention.


C. ***Applications for Annual Fireworks License and Permit for Temporary Structures***
An annual application for a license to sell fireworks devices must be submitted to the Loudon County Building Commissioner's Office between October 1 and December 31 of the prior year in which the operator plans to sell fireworks. A license must be obtained prior to the sale of any fireworks devices. Each application for a license must be accompanied by the following documentation:

- Evidence that special exception approval for fireworks sales and storage has been obtained from the Loudon County Board of Zoning Appeals. (This requirement does not apply to any fireworks operations in existence prior to April 7, 2003, the date of adoption of this amendment by the Loudon County Commission)
- A current Tennessee State Fireworks Retailers License issued by the Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance Division of Fire Prevention
- Certificate(s) of insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000 for public general liability, bodily injury and property damage. Loudon County shall be named as an additional insured on the certificate of insurance.


Permit for Temporary Structures

A separate building permit is required from the Loudon County Building Commissioner for licensed fireworks operators to sell from temporary structures on the site of the permanent sales operation. The sale and storage of fireworks from a temporary structure may only be owned and operated by the owner of the permanent sales facility. The days and hours of operation are subject to the State of Tennessee's regulations for temporary fireworks sales operations.

Morton Railroad Crossing**

A resolution authorizing implementation of changes and improvements required to make vital corrections at grade crossing (U.S. DOT # 731-475k.) of Norfolk Southern Railroad and Morton Road in Loudon County.

WHEREAS: Morton Road and Norfolk Southern Railroad crossing was inspected by the Railway Safety Inspector of the Tennessee Department of Transportation.

WHEREAS: The railway inspector reported, "I highly recommend serious consideration of the straightening of this road." (Morton Road)

WHEREAS: Morton Road runs closely parallel to and makes an abrupt and sharp left turn up a slope and across the railroad tracks. This crossing is not in compliance with U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration's Railroad-Highway Grade Crossing Handbook.

WHEREAS: This crossing is rated by TDOT as having twenty trains per day at sixty miles per hour.

WHEREAS: Loudon County School Buses cross this crossing three times daily with a student exposure of twenty six (26) per school day.

WHEREAS: The TDOT Regional Vehicle Traffic Engineer has reviewed this crossing in person and was successful in acquiring a TDOT Safety Improvement Grant for this project of One Hundred Thousand Dollars. (\$100,000)

WHEREAS: The Morton Rail Road Crossing is located in a developing and growing region of Loudon County and is expected to be further impacted.

WHEREAS: Various Loudon County officials have written emphasizing the need for improvements at this crossings including the Loudon County Sheriff, Loudon County School Superintendent, Loudon County Highway Superintendent, Loudon County Executive, Loudon County Planner, State Representative, State Senator and neighborhood 4H members collected thirty-four signatures of their neighbors in the community and mailed it to their State Officials.

WHEREAS: One property owner adjacent to this project is offering to donate right-of-way to facilitate widening the vehicle road at this crossing.

WHEREAS: The Railroad has an existing one hundred feet right-of-way from the center of the track on both sides.

WHEREAS: Realignment of Morton Road straight to Martel Road is a must for providing a necessary drainage alignment capability for construction of flooding control on Martel Road. Design and culvert funding has been already approved and waiting for Morton Road to be realigned to begin the flooding control project.

WHEREAS: There is a six-hundred and forty-four (644) acre drainage basin draining through Martel Road without any provisions for water and flooding control. One hundred twenty-two homes (approximately 500 people) are effected about twice a year by having to forge through flooding water to get home. This flooding area has traffic of 2,497 vehicles per day and is closed by the County Highway Department during heavy flooding.

WHEREAS: The flooding of Martel resident's property is a long time and arduous burden. The lack of any water flow control allows water to flow at will around, through, over and causing ponds in lake likeness is a serious detriment to their community. The property flooding is resultant of Loudon County not sufficiently enforcing controls during development in this area some years ago.




