RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF LOUDON COUNTY, TENNESSEE, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER SEVEN, §13-7-105 OF THE TENNESSEE CODE ANNOTATED, TO REZONE APPROXIMATELY 17.4 ACRES FROM A-1 (AGRICULTURE-FORESTRY) TO C-2 (GENERAL COMMERCIAL). REFERENCED BY: TAX MAP 44, PARCEL(S) 61.28, 61.29, 61.30, LOCATED ON HIGHWAY 321 AT FRIENDSVILLE ROAD, 3rd LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Loudon County Commission, in accordance with Chapter Seven, §13-7-105 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, may from time to time, amend the number, shape, boundary, area or any regulation of or within any district or districts, or any other provision of any zoning resolution, and

WHEREAS, the Regional Planning Commission has forwarded a recommendation regarding the amendment to the Zoning Map of Loudon County, Tennessee, and

WHEREAS, a notice of public hearing and a description of the resolution appeared in the Loudon County News Herald on September 15/16, 2010 consistent with the provisions of Tennessee Code Annotated, §13-7-105,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Loudon County Commission that the Zoning Map of Loudon County, Tennessee be amended as follows:

Located on Highway 321, situated in the 3rd Legislative District, referenced by Tax Map 44, Parcel(s) 61.28, 61.29, 61.30 be rezoned from A-1, Agriculture-Forestry District to C-2, General Commercial District, as shown on the attached map; said map being part of this Resolution.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately, the public welfare requiring it.

Resolution Declaring Loudon Lion's Club Day

WHEREAS, caring adults of Loudon chartered the Loudon Lion's Club on November 19, 1935 to provide needed services in their local community and joined the International Association of Lion's Clubs to make use of their valuable resources and expertise, and;

WHEREAS, the Loudon Lion's Club has for 75 years been able to attract local caring businessmen and others who wished to assist in satisfying various social needs in our community, and;

WHEREAS, the Loudon Lion's Club throughout its history has donated thousands of dollars and hundreds of community service hours annually to assist local individuals with vision needs, to provide youth scholarships, and to provide for countless other local needed services, and;

WHEREAS, the Loudon Lion's Club, in association with some 45 Lion's Clubs located in 23 upper East Tennessee counties, has donated tens of thousands of dollars annually throughout Lion's District 12N to support sighted and vision impaired youth programs, to provide educational materials to visually impaired individuals, to provide meaningful employment for vision impaired adults, and for research into curing diabetes, and;

WHEREAS, the Loudon Lion's Club, in association with some 200 Lion's Clubs located in Tennessee, has donated over a hundred thousand dollars annually across Lion's multi-district 12 for the prevention of childhood blindness through the vision screening of children ages six months to six years and assisting other organizations in the treatment of sight related health issues, and;

WHEREAS, the Loudon Lion's Club, in association with some 45,000 Lion's Clubs in 206 countries and geographical areas of the world, has donated over 250 million dollars since the 1990's, preventing over 100 million people from going blind and providing restoration of sight to over 7 million people through cataract surgery; also donating an additional 20 million dollars annually to combating disability, promoting health, serving youth, and providing disaster relief around the world.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that I, on behalf of the grateful citizens of Loudon, thank you, the Loudon Lion's Club, for 75 years of service committed to improving the quality of life in the Loudon community, and;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, by the power of my office as Loudon County Mayor, I declare November 19, 2010 will be designated Loudon Lion's Club Day and I encourage every citizen of Loudon to personally thank a Loudon Lion and consider joining them in their future service to our community.
