Redistricting Committee Meeting

July 7, 2011

6 P.M.

The Redistricting Committee of Loudon County meet on July 7, 2011 at the Loudon County Office Building on River Road. The meeting was called to order by Mayor Estelle Herron. Members present were: Mayor Estelle Herron, Commissioners Roy Bledsoe, David Meers, Don Miller and Sharon Yarbrough and Harold Duff. Members Susan Harrison, Russ Newman, Ryan Janikula, Steve Fritts and Carolyn Harper were also present. Commissioners Steve Harrelson, Earlena Maples, Bob Franke, Austin Shaver were absent.

The Mayor said the first item of business was to elect a chair, vice-chair and a secretary. She made the recommendation that Russ Newman be named chair, Carolyn Harper vice-chair and Susan Harrison be named secretary. Commissioner Bledsoe made the motion to accept the recommendation and was 2nd by Commissioner Miller. All present voted yes with no opposing votes. Mayor Herron then turned the meeting over to Chairman Newman.

Chairman Newman then introduced Gary D. Hayes with CTAS. Mr. Hayes then spoke to the committee about the responsibilities of this committee. He spoke about the maps that he provided and said that the total deviation was 47.5 %. The problems in the deviation were in districts 1, 4 and 7. Once a map is approved then the committee will work with the Election Commission to work on precinct lines. Once all is done then the committee will submit a map to the State.

Commissioner Meers asked the questions what was everybody's thoughts about keeping the 10 commissioners that we currently have. Chairman Newman said that was a key decision and would help if we could make that decision on the front end and not waste time moving boundaries. Commissioner Bledsoe made the motion to keep the current number of 10 commissioners. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Meers and all present voted yes with no opposing votes.

Russ Newman went over the commission district population chart that he had compiled. He explained that each commissioner should ideally represent 4,856. Once again stating the problems with the deviation is in districts 1, 4 and 7. Questions were raised about if voters would be voting in the new precincts in the next election year and if a new polling place could be established if needed.

It was decided that we would meet again on July 21, 28 and August 4, 2011 at 6 P.M. at the Loudon County office building. Ryan Janikula gave a short demonstration on how the redistricting software worked. It was agreed that Ryan would work on several versions of changing the map and present them at the July 21 meeting. Commissioner Bledsoe made the motion to adjourn and Vice-Chair Harper seconded the motion.

ISSUE: Rebalance the population disparity between District 7, District 1, and District 4

	<u>Population Disparity</u>
District 7	+1,700
District 1	-1, 200
District 4	- 400

PLAN 1:

Objective: Maintain the current district boundaries as close to current boundaries, while trying to keep Tellico Village within District 7.

Changes:

District 1: Adds Tommotley Neighborhood of Tellico Village and keeps Coyatee Neighborhood west of Tellico Pkwy.

Adds the Davis/Piney area formerly in District 7.

District 4: Adds the Rarity Bay Community formerly in District 7.

PLAN 2:

Objective: Maintain the current district boundaries as close to current boundaries, while putting the Davis/Piney Community back in District 4 and keeping as much of Tellico Village in District 7 as possible.

Changes:

District 1: Adds Tommotley Neighborhood, Coyatee Neighborhood, Coyatee Views and entire north end of Tellico Village on both sides of Tellico Parkway.

District 4: Adds the Davis/Piney area formerly in District 7.

CASE A:

Objective: Move approximately 1,600 from Dist. 7 to Dist. 4, and move approximately 1,200 from Dist. 4 to Dist. 1.

Changes:

District 1: Adds area north of Ross Rd. and Pond Creek Rd from Hwy. 11 to County line which was in Dist. 4. Includes Foshee, Big Sandy, Bright, Stockton Valley Rd., Jim Dyke, and Prospect Church Rds.

District 4: Adds Davis/ Piney Area, Chatuaga Neighborhood west of Tellico Pkwy., Mialaquo Neighborhood and Rarity Bay formerly in Dist. 7

CASE B:

Objective: Move approximately 1,600 from Dist. 7 to Dist. 1 and move approximately 400 from Dist. 1 to Dist. 7.

Changes:

District 1: Adds Tommotley, Coytee, and Tanasi Neighborhoods from both sides of Tellico Parkway down to Ottawa Place and Tanasi Dr.

District 4: Adds Davis/Piney area from Dist. 7

CASE C:

Objective: Split Tellico Village in half between Dist. 1 and Dist. 4 to achieve population balance. Combine the remainder of Dist. 1 and Dist. 4 into a single district.

District 1: Adds north half of Tellico Village from Maple Hill Rd. and including Tanasi, Tommotley, and Coytee Neighborhoods. Dist. 1 loses all area west of Hwy. 72 over to Hwy. 11.



District 7: Adds area east of Hwy. 72 from Steekee School Rd. south to Wade Rd. east. This area was formerly in Dist. 4.

District 4: Adds area west of Hwy. 72 from Hwy. 11 to the County line. This area was formerly in Dist. 1.

 District 7 Goes From 35.3% To 5.20%






District 7 Goes From 35.3% To 3.82%






District 7 Goes From 35.3% To -0.71%






District 7 Goes From 35.3% To -2.65%





